This event is the first of its kind. We aim to connect Wyoming's businesses and key organizations with tomorrow's policymakers.

The event will facilitate meaningful conversation between industry leaders and candidates about policies that matter. Many top job creators in the state will be represented on the business side as well as key partners to the WBA. Candidates that have filed to run for the Wyoming Legislature are invited to attend.

We plan to have industries/businesses/ partners at tables and candidates will be given time to visit each table. This will be almost a speed dating approach.

Industries that will be represented: Oil/gas, mining, tourism, agriculture, construction, finance, gaming, creative economy, manufacturing, and we will have partners in attendance like the Wyoming Taxpayers, AARP, County Commissioners, Airports, and others.



Conversations Between Business/ Industry and Candidates

"Speed Dating" Event

Tables will be grouped by industry or organization clusters of 3 to 5 people at each table. Industry and business will sit on one side of the table. Candidates will move through each table in groups of 3-5 across from industry and business.

If an organization does not have enough people to fill a table, they may have a booth or spot in the room where candidates can engage.

Candidates will be grouped with no candidates competing against each other in the same group. The Candidate



groups will be assigned to an initial table and will have 10-15 minutes at each table. This is an opportunity for the industry/organization representatives at each table to offer a 3 to 5 minute overview of their industry or organization and lay out a few key priorities. Candidates can then answer questions and have a dialogue for the remaining time.

Every 10-15 minutes we will ask the candidate groups to move to the next table/cluster.

Candidates and business/industry will then have the opportunity to network and talk in a less formal setting after 6:30 pm during the reception. We are looking forward to seeing you there!


